South Dublin County Council is a Local Authority employing 1,700 staff with annual expenditure on supplies and services in 2007 of approximately €113 million.

It provides a wide and diverse range of services to the people of South Dublin (population approximately 250,000). Activities are carried out both in the physical works area and in the social services area.

South Dublin County Council is responsible for the social, economic, infrastructural and cultural development of the County.

Amongst the major services provided by the Council are - Roads, Housing, Environmental Services, Planning and Development , Parks, Libraries , Sport and Recreation.

South Dublin County Council's facilities are spread geographically throughout the South County Dublin. The principal offices are located at County Hall, Tallaght, Dublin 24.
